Please let us know if you need any of your child's login details.

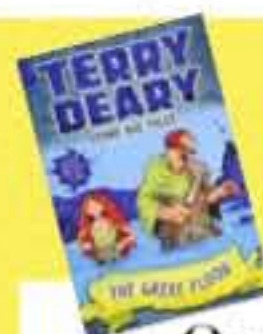


Class Dojo

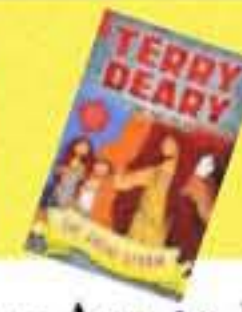


We are still contactable via Class Dojo. Please send us a message if there are any questions or concerns that you may have.
