

PE

Children have one weekly PE lesson and a daily activity - this could be 'Wake Up Shake Up' or 'Just Dance'. This will happen at the start of the school day and has proven to improve both physical and mental health, and boost attainment.

PE is on Thursdays for both Year 5 classes. Please ensure that children bring correct kit every week. PE kit is a plain green t-shirt and plain shorts or joggers. Earrings (studded) **must be removed** for PE.



Home Learning

Reading at home, spellings & learning times tables are the main focus for the home learning the children receive in Year 5. Children should be reading at least 5 times a week in Year 5, this will help them with all of their learning during the school day.

Children will also bring home spellings to learn on a Monday night, they will then be tested on a Friday. These spellings will focus on a different spelling rule each week.

As times tables knowledge forms a key role in many mathematical concepts, it is important that children learn times tables facts up to 12x12 fluently. We would like to encourage you to support your child in learning these facts at home on a regular basis.
