Tapestry is an easy-to-use and secure online learning journal helping you and us celebrate your child's learning and development. ClassDojo enables you to see instantly any shared photos, videos, and announcements on Class Story, or private messages from us.

Every Wednesday, Reception children will take part in their PE lesson. Children need to bring their PE kit in a bag with their name on each item of clothing. PE uniform is plain black shorts/jogging bottoms, Bader PE t-shirts (available to purchase from school) and plimsolls/trainers. As the weather gets colder, children will need to wear jogging bottoms and a plain black long sleeved jumper or hoodie.

Your child will be given a book bag containing some learning resources and 3 reading books. Children are given a range of different reading books. The story book is for you to share with your child, the phonics book matches the phase we are working at and the book banded text supports reading skills such as recognising high frequency words.

Please ensure your child brings their book bag every day, they will be changed once a week.

This Term

Alongside child initiated play, we will be using a range of topics, to support and extend the children's learning. Our Autumn Term topics are;

We will also be learning about our Bader Values and how they link to the wider community.

Read for the stars

Children are encouraged to read at home regularly. Every time your child reads at home they will move through the planets to reach the sun. Children are rewarded for their love of reading by receiving a certificate and a book of their choice.

At home, you can help your child by encouraging them to be independent whilst getting dressed and putting coats and shoes on. Encourage your child to identify numbers and letters whilst in your local environment. Don't forget to practice drawing and name writing!
