All we ask that children read a minimum of 4 times a week in Early Years and Key Stage 1 and 5 times a week in Key Stage 2 (up to the maximum of seven times a week). We would love children to read more than 1 book/ chapter a night at home but they will only have 1 stamp a day recorded in their reading rocket card. They work their way through the planets until they reach the sun and then as a reward for their enjoyment of books (and their work), they will receive a certificate and book of their choice in assembly (and their star on our display). Last week, we celebrated the 'front runners' in each year group as, as a school we value reading more than anything in our curriculum. Children who are not reading at home now will need to read in school, at playtime, if this is a regular occurrence and is 'in line with' our home/school agreement. Thank you for your support.
