A message from Mr Hodgson

Our positive start to the school year has obviously been tinged with much sadness today, with the news that Her Majesty the Queen Elizabeth II, sadly passed away yesterday afternoon. Our thoughts are with the Royal Family at this time. As we join the nation in mourning, we pay tribute to the contribution Her Majesty has made around the world through decades of public service. Staff and children have discussed this today in school, within their classes as appropriate, and we have held a minute's silence as a school, to reflect on her life and as a mark of respect.



Attendance

The importance of being punctual and coming to school can never be underestimated, in terms of contributing massively to children's learning. They work their way through the planets until they reach the sun and then as a reward for their enjoyment of books (and their work), they will receive a certificate and book of their choice in assembly (and their star on our display).


