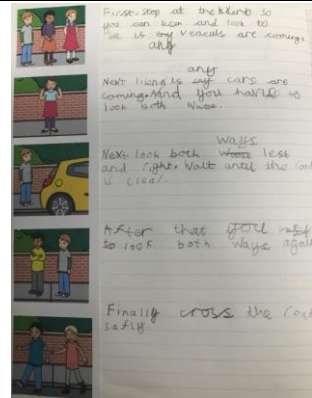

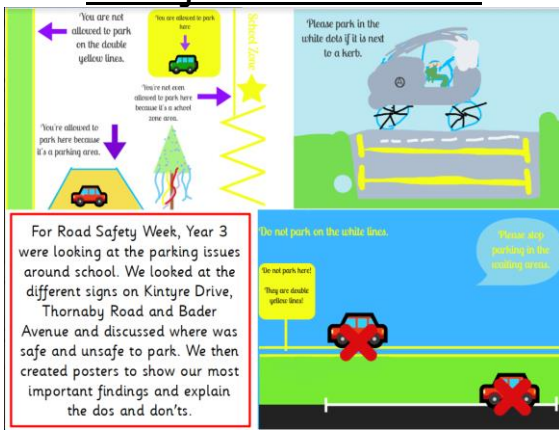

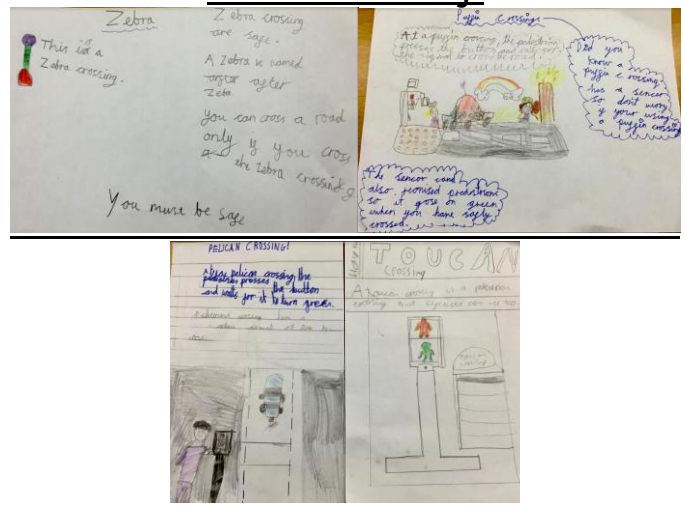

Road Safety Statistics.

- Children that are younger than 10 years old, are highly at risk of being in a road safety accident.
- Children have accidents on the road because of poor supervision or being distracted.
- Most accidents are caused by people who speed.
- As a child gets older, it has more of a risk of getting seriously injured or even worse.
- Men and young boys are normally injured by speeding cars.

This week, our JRSOs monitored parking issues around school as part of Road Safety Week 2022.

These are some of the dangers that our JRSOs noticed this morning:

Cars stopping on the yellow zig zags at both school entrances, making it difficult for other cars to pass, and dangerous for children crossing the road.

Cars pulling over the kerb and onto grass verges.

Cars parking on single white lines (this is not against the law, but the white line is to discourage parking in order to keep our children safe).
