Attendance Update

The first full week's attendance was almost 95% which is encouraging as this is school's target. Positively too, we had 253 pupils with full attendance (again this is encouraging). Mr Garbutt sent out 23 letters for unauthorised absences. Miss Weir's class were the best attending class again with almost 99% attendance – well done to them again! Punctuality is a concern at the moment with 56 lates recorded for the school week. Arriving late to school means children miss vital learning at the start of the school day and often play 'catch up' for the rest of the day. Mr Garbutt, our attendance officer, will be sending out punctuality letters next week to remind parents/carers about the importance of arriving at school on time.

School has a 'soft' start to the school day with gates open from 8.40 until the bell goes at 8.55am – a full 15 minutes to get into school.

All we ask that children read a minimum of 4 times a week in Early Years and Key Stage 1 and 5 times a week in Key Stage 2 (up to the maximum of seven times a week). We would love children to read more than 1 book/ chapter a night at home but they will only have 1 stamp a day recorded in their reading rocket card. They work their way through the planets until they reach the sun and then as a reward for their enjoyment of books (and their work), they will receive a certificate and book of their choice in assembly (and their star on our display). Children who are not reading at home now will need to read in school, at playtime, if this is a regular occurrence, and is 'in line with' our home/school agreement.
