Attendance Update

Last week's attendance was again almost 95% which is encouraging as this is school's target. Positively too, we had 250 pupils with full attendance (again this is encouraging). Mr Garbutt sent out 7 letters for unauthorised absences, 6 term time leave of absence letters and 9 punctuality letters were issued. Miss Dunn's class were the best attending class with almost 99% attendance – well done to them!

Punctuality is still a concern at the moment with 73 lates recorded for the school week (too many). Arriving late to school means children miss vital learning at the start of the school day and often play 'catch up' for the rest of the day. Mr Garbutt, our attendance officer, has sent out punctuality letters now to remind parents/carers about the importance of arriving at school on time.

School has a 'soft' start to the school day with gates open from 8.40 until the bell goes at 8.55am – a full 15 minutes to get into school.
