

## Attendance Update

Attendance in school during Autumn term was disappointing, overall. September started well with attendance at the expected level (95%) for the first week but then unfortunately, the weeks thereafter were largely poor. There has been a lot of illness with sickness bugs etc. nonetheless, school attendance for Autumn term was lower than National attendance figures.

School sent out 35 Persistent Absence letters last term, 54 unauthorised absence letters, 14 Term Time Leave of Absence letters, started 12 attendance plans and made 4 referrals to the Local Authority.


