

Attendance Update

Week 5 attendance, unfortunately, dipped below the 95% target. As you can see from the chart above, that equates to 11 days absence across the school year and impacts on a child's education considerably.

Mr Garbutt, our attendance officer, issued 10 punctuality letters, 4 term time leave of absence letters, 1 persistent absence letter and 3 letters for unauthorised absence. Punctuality is still a big concern, with 70 lates being recorded last week.
