Attendance Update

Week 6 attendance, unfortunately, was below the 95% target. As you can see from the chart above, that equates to 11 days absence across the school year and impacts on a child's education considerably.

Mr Garbutt, our attendance officer, issued, 4 term time leave of absence letters and 4 letters for unauthorised absence. Punctuality was better but still with 52 lates being recorded last week.

We did have 255 pupils with 100% attendance in week 6 though so well done to them! Also, we have <u>32</u> Children with 100% attendance since September and <u>122</u> children this half term.
