Industrial Action

As advised earlier this week via class dojo, there is industrial action taking place on <u>Thursday 27th April and Tuesday</u> <u>2nd May</u> by members of the NEU teaching union. To reaffirm, <u>school is open</u> to all pupils on this day although there will be some classes affected by the strike as regards to the adults teaching/supervising them.

Kings Coronation

On Friday, 5th May, we will be celebrating the coronation of King Charles III. Children are invited to come to school in appropriate red, white and blue clothing as we mark this historic landmark with a day of celebratory activities. We intend



(weather permitting) to have at lunch time, a whole school 'Coronation picnic' on the school field/playground. On this day, our cook, will be making picnic packed lunches instead of hot dinners. School Crossing Patrol Update

After much consultation with the mayor, other ward councillors and the Local Authority the council have advised that a controlled crossing is the most appropriate AND the introduction of a School Crossing Patrol Service would only cause confusion as drivers can sometimes stop at green lights, thinking the patroller may step out causing vehicle shunt collisions. The solution they have suggested is consideration of introducing a speed hump, which wouldn't necessarily prevent red light running but it would mean that drivers would have to adjust their speed to travel over the hump and this would reduce road safety risks that way. This is currently being explored by the ward councillors.

Head Teacher's Award
