All we ask that children read a minimum of 4 times a week in Early Years and Key Stage 1 and 5 times a week in Key Stage 2 (up to the maximum of seven times a week). Attendance Update

The first week back after Easter, overall, was an improving picture with an average of almost 96% (school's target). Everyday, apart from Friday, school attendance was very good (over 96% Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday) Friday seems to be a problem? as it always is the lowest day for attendance unfortunately. Mr Garbutt, our attendance officer issued, 1 term time leave of absence letter, 10 letters for unauthorised absence and submitted two refferals to the Local Authority. Punctuality was better than the previous week with 47 lates being recorded.

The good news, we did have 257 pupils with 100% attendance in week 1 of summer term so a big well done to them! Also, we still have 21 Children with 100% attendance since September.
