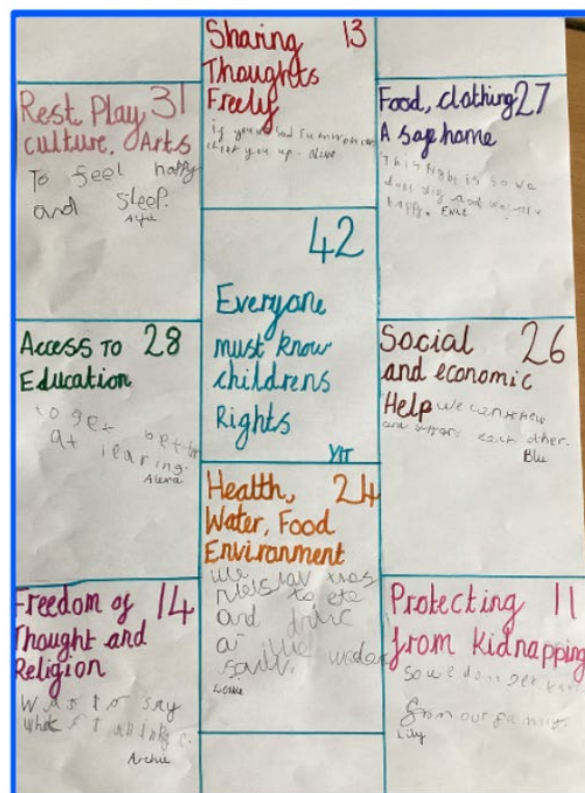
Nursery

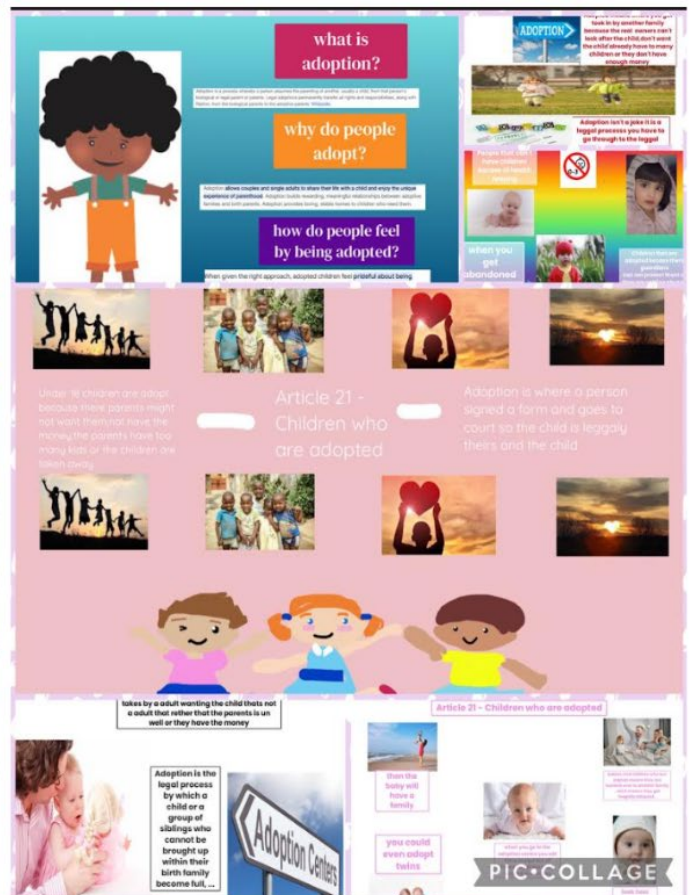


Year 3

Year 3W children looked at Article 24 and explored all the different activities we do in school to stay fit and healthy.

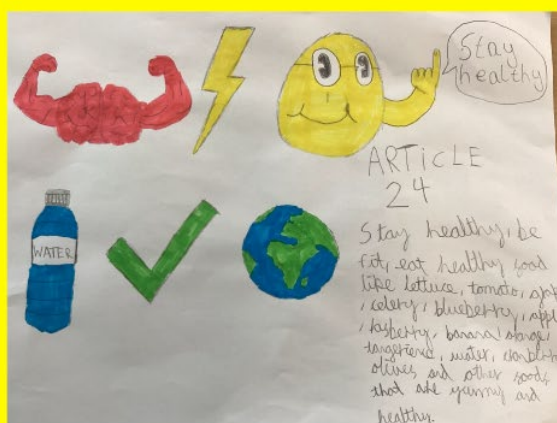
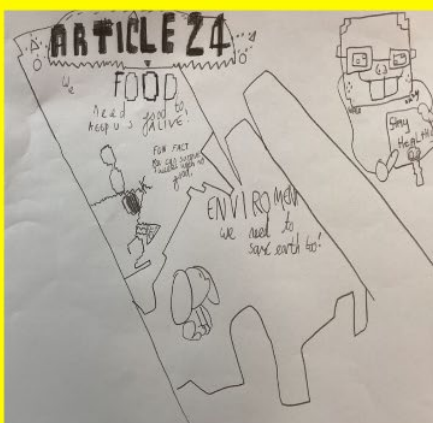
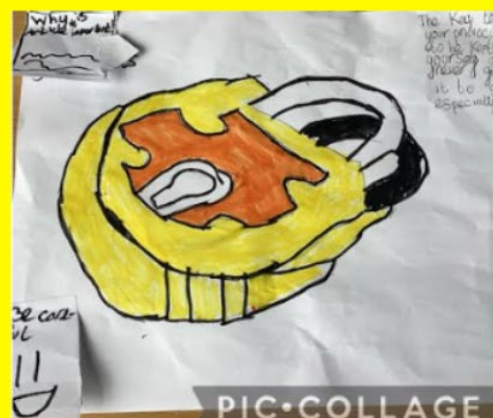
Year 3B children looked at Article 42. It is really important that all children know their rights.
