Attendance Update

We had an improvement on overall school attendance last week with us almost hitting the magical 95% or better target. (94.8%). The attendance team sent out 8 unauthorised absence letters in this week and will be sending out letters over the next two weeks to parents/carers of children who are currently in persistent absence (i.e. their attendance is below 90%) and their attendance is causing concern. Please work with us on attendance and flag up any support needed as soon as possible. Please also, report any absences to the school office on the day of absence to prevent unnecessary call from the attendance team. Thank you for your support with this.

Read for the Stars

We continue to encourage children to read for pleasure at home and are now well on the way to the 'sun'. All we ask that children read a minimum of 4 times a week in Early Years and Key Stage 1 and 5 times a week in Key Stage 2 (up to the maximum of seven times a week). We would love children to read more than 1 book/chapter a night at home but they will only have 1 stamp a day recorded in their reading rocket card. They work their way through the planets until they reach the sun and then as a reward for their enjoyment of books (and their work), they will receive a certificate and book of their choice in assembly (and their star on our display). We have calculated that on November 6th if a child reads everyday, they will have reached the sun on the blue (1st) rocket and obviously get to choose a book from the machine or the book case in my office.
