Rights Respecting School

As a silver accredited, Rights Respecting School, we look at an Article every 2 weeks. For the next two weeks:



Right of the fortnight

- Article 13 Sharing thoughts freely
 - Children have the right to share freely with others what they learn, think and feel, by talking, drawing, writing or in any other way unless it harms other people.

Next month, we will be assessed for as a 'Gold' respecting school and Miss Weir, the staff and the children, are working hard to achieve this. This week, every child from Nursery to Year 6 has done something very exciting to do with Rights Respecting and the articles – why not ask them what it was? (It will be posted soon!)

Read for the Stars

We continue to encourage children to read for pleasure at home and are now well on the way to the 'sun'. All we ask that children read a minimum of 4 times a week in Early Years and Key Stage 1 and 5 times a week in Key Stage 2 (up to the maximum of seven times a week). We would love children to read more than 1 book/chapter a night at home but they will only have 1 stamp a day recorded in their reading rocket card. They work their way through the planets until they reach the sun and then as a reward for their enjoyment of books (and their work), they will receive a certificate and book of their choice in assembly (and their star on our display). We have calculated that on November 6th if a child reads everyday, they will have reached the sun on the blue (1st) rocket and obviously get to choose a book from the machine or the book case in my office. I am expecting to be inundated after the half term! Currently the vending machine is undertaking a bit of a make-over, watch this space!



Super Spellers

We continue to push with spelling in school this year. The class Spelling Bee is a weekly class reward for the class with the best spellings scores and an individual reward of a 'Super Speller' certificate and a pencil are earned by any of our children who achieve full marks in spelling test consistently.
