
A message from Mr Hodgson

Attendance Update

The fifth full week back in school and attendance was unfortunately down to 91.2% which is worse than the previous week and a long from our target of 95% or better. Today, attendance was 83.5%

The attendance team sent out 2 unauthorised absence letters and 3 persistent absence letters.

This week, we have held attendance meetings with parents/carers and will be holding more in the coming weeks. An attendance plan is put into place which involves working with school to improve your child's attendance & having to avoid making a referral to the Local Authority attendance team and thus, avoid incurring fixed penalties. This is the procedure that we must follow.

Please also, report any absences to the school office on the day of absence to prevent unnecessary call from the attendance team.

Attendance is so important and thank you for supporting school with this.
