Year 6 have PE on a Friday

KS2 SATs 2024

SATs will start the w/c 13th May. Please do not book any holidays during this week. Children can come into school from 8:30am through the main office, where breakfast will be provided. Please ensure that children have a good night's sleep and arrive at school promptly. The schedule for the week is as follows:

Monday 13th May – English, grammar, punctuation and spelling

Tuesday 14th May — English reading

Wednesday 15th May – Mathematics papers 1 (arithmetic) and 2 (reasoning)

Thursday 16th May — Mathematics paper 3 (reasoning)

There will be no tests on the Friday (17^{th}) .

Y6 will have their leavers' assembly and prom to look forward to in their final half term at Bader. Dates TBC.

School Uniform

Children should have white shirts/polo shirts, green jumper/cardigan, grey/black trousers, skirt or pinafores. If wearing leggings, they must be covered by a skirt or pinafore. Footwear must be black shoes or plain black trainers. Children are not allowed to wear jewellery unless it is stud earrings. Please ensure all clothing is labelled with children's names to avoid them getting mixed up.

Y6 leavers' hoodies are expected to arrive after SATs and will be handed out to children in due course.

Children will be allowed to wear them as part of their uniform. It is important that Y6 follow the uniform policy up until their last day, as this will set them in good stead for the expectations of secondary school.

As the weather begins to get hotter, you may want children to apply sun cream before they come to school and to bring a sun hap or cap for break times and lunchtimes.
