Important Information

Welcome back to the final term of the year! I am looking forward to a fun-filled term with lots of exciting lessons and activities in store.

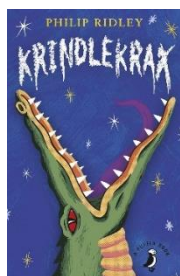
I am excited to share that Y3 will be going on an exciting trip this term that is linked to their history and science learning!

Start time: School doors will open at 8:40 and close at 8:55am.

Finish time: 3:15pm

Uniform: Children should have white shirts/polo shirts, green jumper or cardigan and grey/black trousers, skirt or pinafores. If wearing leggings, they must be covered by a skirt or pinafore. Footwear must be black shoes or plain black trainers.

PE Days: Y3's PE days will be Monday and Wednesday. Please can PE kits remain in school during the week. Children should not wear jewellery for PE and their hair should be tied up and away from the face.



Summer: As the weather begins to get hotter, you may want children to apply sun cream before they come to school and to bring a sun hat or cap for break times and lunch times.



Home Learning:

Children will receive spellings and times tables on a Monday, these are also put on Seesaw and Class Dojo. Spellings should be learned over the week in preparation for a times tables and a spelling test on a Friday.

The 'Bader Spelling Bee' spelling initiative will continue this term. The children will compete against other classes to get the highest average score to be in with the chance to become 'Royal Spelling Bee' for that week!

The whole school reading initiative 'Read for the Stars' will also continue this term. Please can you continue to read with your child regularly at home. The expectation for KS2 is that the children read at home 5 times a week. I look forward to seeing the children reach the Sun and collect a book from the vending machine.

Our Learning

This term, Y3's history topic is Ancient Egypt. During this topic, the children will learn about the lifestyle, customs and beliefs of the Ancient Egyptians. They will explore the structures of the pyramids, the process of mummification and the youngest pharaoh, Tutankhamun. Children will discover the continent of Africa and identify where Egypt is on a map. They will look closely at the River Nile and discover the physical and human features of Egypt. In English, Y3's class text will be 'Krindlekrax' by Philip Ridley.
